First, DG GROW is consulting on the development of a fair and balanced licensing framework for SEPs. In parallel, DG COMP address the application of competition rules to standardisation agreements, of which patented technology and FRAND licensing can be part, in its drafts of the revised horizontal block exemption regulations (HBERs) and guidelines on horizontal cooperation (Horizontal Guidelines). A third interesting development in relation to FRAND licensing is the Commission's proposal for the Data Act, in which FRAND principles are proposed to be applied to data access.
